The name of Benjamin Ingham is little known in connection with the religious revival of the 18th, compared with Whitefield and the Wesleys. Yet it was he who was first instrumental in the evangelical awakening in the north of England. He preached widely among the dales of Yorkshire, the forests of Lancashire, and the fells of Cumbria in very difficult circumstances, yet to great effect. This detailed historical study follows his separation from John Wesley, to his connection with the Moravians, and then the rise of a denomination bearing his name.

This set is the substance of 11 sermons preached by William Gadsby in Manchester. It is based upon James 1:25, and explains the meaning of the gospel in every view of it as ‘the perfect will of God in Christ Jesus’. Hence it contains both promise and precept – a message of life to the sinner, and a rule of life to the believer.

A new look at the Composer, the Music and the Message. Handel’s *Messiah* continues to attract enthusiastic hearers over 250 years since it was composed. His Christian character is often overlooked, and particularly its bearing upon his work. This book contains an account of Handel’s life in the first section, followed by a second which provides a commentary upon the words and music of this masterly Oratorio, with spiritual application of the scriptures involved.

This is a short story for children of age 8+. It is set in a coal village in the 1880s and follows the experience of a young, fatherless, boy working in a coalmine who is caught up in a pitfall. The story is exciting and fast moving with descriptions and pictures to stir the imagination of young readers either reading for themselves or having the story read to them. The narrative moves along with short chapters and the ending will encourage readers to see beyond the simple storyline to the message of freedom in Christ and liberty from the darkness of this evil world.

The first book in the 'Huguenot Inheritance Series'. This follows the adventures of Huguenot children fleeing persecution in 17th century France, following the revocation of the edict of Nantes. Early in the story their mother dies and their father is banished to be a galley-slave for life. Yet in spite of threats and punishments John and his sister Manette refuse to give up the faith they have been taught.
